Notes from the Field!

Our Learn to Grow; Grow to Give initiative blends food literacy and food security by growing fresh, healthy foods for families while providing equitable, accessible food education. **This summer we launched Phase 2 and broke ground on our new urban farm!** This expansion is already helping us grow more food boxes and cultivate additional learning and volunteer opportunities.

Phase 2 Progress

- Our first acre is underway, with a mixture of active growing space, cover cropping and tarping to prepare the soil for spring planting!
- Our team of staff and volunteers transformed what was just empty grass into a thriving urban farm with all the amenities: a shed, fencing, seating, shade sails, a washing station and water access. A huge accomplishment for our small but mighty team!
- A dedicated garden van now helps us harvest and deliver the fruits of our labour.
- Production has expanded from serving White Oaks Public School to also serving Lord Elgin Public School, with two additional schools planned for the new year.
- Spring field trips are being planned so students can dig into hands-on learning.

Partnerships and Community Impact

We could not have done this project without WSIB, who generously shared their land with us, and the ongoing support and guidance of the London Food Bank. Neighbourhood Resource Centres, OSNP volunteers and School Support Counsellors assist with distribution and gather anonymous feedback from families, ensuring what we grow is culturally-relevant, wanted and community-informed.

While growing this new phase, our other garden spaces have continued to flourish. We've run programs, attended community events and explored food systems with partners like the London Public Library, Storybook Gardens, Childreach, Western Fair Association, Kiwanis, Investing in Children and many more.
